## National Equality Register an Overview

The National Equality Register supports and enables the goals embedded in the Equality ACT to be implemented.

Enables reporting of Equality Information to be transparent

Supports a sustainable Equality Framework

Enables individual organisations to take responsibility for their own equality management

## Steps to an Organisation's Equality Status

1. All organisations complete a basic registration
2. Those who supplying the public sector would be required to complete the PQQ
3. Then submit evidence of equality policies and practices if they win a Public Tender or Contract
4. Verification of evidence would be required
5. Working towards accreditation
6. Accreditation

## Outcomes and Responsibilities

The National Equality Register enables outcomes, trends and change to be measured and reported by public bodies



It also enables suppliers to meet their contractual equality responsibilities

## Equality Management

Managing equality is made simple; by allowing each organisation to take responsible for

its own equality management (meeting any contractual equality responsibilities by achieving its required



equality status)

- > The Equality ACT has become law.
- > EHRC is working to update the Statutory Codes of Practice.
- > The ACT and Codes of Practice will strengthen the Equality Statutory Duty on Public Bodies and suppliers through Public Procurement.
- > Over 350,000 suppliers work with public bodies.
- > According to Government public Procurement amounts to £225Bn. There are approx 25000 organisations who will be subject to an Equality Public Duty (Local Authorities/ NHS/Central Government/ etc)
